

Transient Reactive Papulotranslucent Acrokeratoderma

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Figure 1: An inherited or genetic skin disease of unclear aetiology is intermittent reactive papulotranslucent acrokeratoderma (TRPA). It is marked by edema, wrinkling and white papules and plaques of the palms and soles after 3-5 minutes of contact with water, which usually resolves after drying within a brief period of time. Symmetrical, hypopigmented papules and plaques emerged on the palms after exposure to water, wrinkles were seen and there were much more pronounced eccrine pores.

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
